Sun Valley Fliers Club Meeting Minutes January 6, 2024

Officers Present: President Frank Moskowitz, Vice-President John Geyer, Treasurer Oliver Heinen, Secretary Mike Peck

Board Members Present: The usual Board role call not taken due to a frosty morning & late start. The Secretary observed the presence of Board members Charlie Beverson, Dan Bott, Jim Sprecker, Val Roqueni, Brian Rhoads, Kenny Rhoads, and Tony Quist... sorry if I missed anyone.

Meeting Open: President Moskowitz called the meeting to order at 9:05 AM at the SVF field.

Guests: None

New Members: Steven Walker, Geoff Grey, Sam Bissell

New Solo Pilots: Louis Butler, congratulations Louis, have fun flying with us.

Secretary's Report: The December 2, 2023 club meeting minutes were not published as there is no Slow Roll newsletter for December. These minutes as well as the January minutes will be published in the February SVF newsletter and approved at the next membership meeting. The Secretary's report was accepted.

Treasurer's Report: Oliver Heinen reported on the amount of funds in the Club treasury, which is adequate for expenses to date. Oliver presented the 2023 treasury recap and a recap of the normal average Club costs for the year. Current membership fees are about 30% below the Club's annual expenses. The SVF Board will review these figures and determine how much and when a dues increase may become effective. Oliver was commended on the completeness of his report and the Club's financial situation for 2024. The report was approved as presented.

Membership Director's Report: The process of renewing individual memberships is continuing; there are over 200 renewals for 2024 to date. About 40 members have not renewed to date, but club membership is expected to reach about 250 during 2024. The Membership Directors report was approved as presented.

Safety Officer's Report: Kenny Rhoads had no reports of any unsafe conditions at the field. Thank you Club members for operating in a safe manner last month.

IT Update: Bobby Santoro will delay launching the new website until the membership renewal process is complete at the end of January 2024.

Field Maintenance Report: Brian Rhoads reported that the SVF will conduct a field cleanup on January 13, 2024 between 9:00 and 11:00 AM. The following items will need to be accomplished:

1. Utilize the steel drag on runway over-runs and the dirt to the North of the runway
2. Shovel debris and smooth the soil on the along the West end of the pits along the parking lot fence.
3. Collect accumulated trash from the desert along the Northern boundary beyond the dirt North of the runway.
4. Remove asphalt chunks from the North edge of the runway.
5. Repaint the orange/white centerline bucket markers East and West of the runway.

All available SVF members are requested to participate. Tasks will be assigned based on members' physical abilities. Refreshments/snacks are planned to be available **for workers**.

Old Business:

1. Ramada permitting is still in progress. Our Civil Engineer, Steve Bargeloh, has advised us that the ramada site plan, the ramada construction details, the exemption for a non-commercial structure, and flood plain hydrology reports have all been accepted by the City of Phoenix commercial planning department. Our permit is expected to be approved within the next 15 days. Mike Peck reminded members that upon receipt of the permit, we will still need to present that the permit to the Maricopa County Flood Control District to have the red tag ceaseconstruction order removed, and potentially pay the fine for starting construction without an approved City of Phoenix permit. After MCFD accepts the permit, construction may begin, but will be dependent on required approved inspections by the City of Phoenix as construction proceeds. Nothing in this process is quick. 2. We are also still waiting on the FAA to approve our field for FRIA status. The Academy of Model Aeronautics Club Services Representative, Lucas Rodden, says he submitted the letter requesting a Remoted ID Authorization for the Sun Valley Fliers on January 3, 2024, and that will cover our club exempting us from the Remote ID requirement until the FRIA is approved by the FAA.
3. Bob Bayless thanked the SVF and the One Eighth Air Force for the excellent support of the Fly-4-Tots event last December. In 2022, the Sun Valley Fliers members collected three large 30X30X36" boxes of toys for the Marine Corps Reserve Toys 4 Tots program. In 2024, the SVF members in conjunction with the One Eighth Air Force members collected 5 large 30X30X36" boxes of toys for the Marine Corps Reserve Toys 4 Tots. Bob thanked all the SVF and OEAF members for their generous contributions and pledged to have another electric event for the same charity this year, with a goal of at least 7 large boxes of toys.

New Business:

1. President Frank is investigating the cost and potential installation schedule of temporary shade screens, temporarily attached to our ramada poles for the Winter Warbirds event. The Board will be presented with the salient cost/installation information at the next Board of Directors meeting.
2. Membership renewals are doing well. We have about 40 previous members on the un-renewed members list, with some of those promising to renew before the end of the month. Previous members are encouraged to renew in January ahead of a potential dues increase. We historically lose 40-50 members during the renewal cycle, so this is about the same as previous years.
3. President Frank said we still need some volunteer help for the gate watch for the upcoming Winter Warbirds event. A Google drive sign up sheet will be going out to all members shortly.

50/50 Raffle: The 50/50 raffle prize of \$28 was won by Paul Delawder who donated his winnings back to the Club treasury. Thank you, Paul, your contribution is appreciated.

Sun Valley Fliers Board of Directors Meeting Minutes – December 13, 2023

1. The Zoom internet meeting was opened at 6:02 PM; there was a quorum present.

Secretary's Report: Mike Peck

1. The Nov. 6, 2023 Board of Directors meeting minutes were motioned, seconded, and approved as published.

Treasurer's Report:

1. The club treasury balance was reported by President Frank as provided by Oliver Heinen, who was not able to participate, and it is adequate for the club's needs.
2. Oliver's accounting presented a very detailed review of categorized income and expenses for the periods of November 1- 30, 2023 and 12-1-2022 through 11-30-2023. This analysis provides the Board with information that member dues are generally insufficient to meet the annual operating expense and desired improvements to the club. Oliver will be asked to determine how much of an increase in dues is warranted.
3. The Treasurer's report was approved by acclamation.

Membership Director's Report: Tony Quist

1. There have been 118 membership renewals to date, and Tony expects a considerable increase in renewals during the next two weeks.

Safety Officer's Report: Ken Rhoads

1. Craig Guest relayed a safety concern expressed by a member regarding another SVF member turbine pilot flying their model at the outer limits of safe visual range North of Jomax road. A designated member of the Board will have a private discussion with the turbine pilot and determine if further action/training is necessary.

Information Technology Report: Bobby Santoro

1. The new website will not be activated until after the membership renewal process tapers down.

Old Business:

1. Ramada permitting – Still in process with the City of Phoenix Planning Dept. A few questions from the City are being addressed by Steve Bargeloh.
2. The December 9th Fly 4 Tots event – SVF expenses were \$335, and the One Eighth Air Force has been asked to provide their half of the co-sponsor cost. There was some concern that the event ended before the announced closing time, as some members showed up to participate in the late morning/early afternoon. While stiff winds and cold made the weather unfavorable, the expressed disappointment was that lunch and the raffle were both concluded by 10:30 AM. A Board member will discuss this with the CD.
3. Winter Warbirds event – The CD stated the event is on track and will be held Jan 26-28, 2024.
4. The 2024 Arizona Classics, Scale Jets, and Warbirds event is on track to be held March 14-17. More information on this event will be provided in the future.

New Business:

1. The Board read and carefully reviewed an e-mail received from Barry Mazer regarding an incident at the December 2, 2023 club meeting, and reached agreement on a decision. President Frank will send Mr. Mazer a letter with the Board's decision.
2. The Board has determined that the Club budget will require an increase in membership dues. Oliver Heinen will provide the Board with an assessment of the amount of the dues increase needed and the increase will become effective after Jan. 31, 2024.
3. The combination to the gate lock will be changed after Jan. 31, 2024. Members of the club in good standing will receive the new combination by e-mail.
4. The FAA has still not granted FRIA status for the Sun Vally Fliers field. Since SVF does have a Letter of Agreement with the FAA at Deer Valley Tower, the AMA will submit a Remote ID Authorization to the FAA which is just as binding as a FRIA in terms of being able to fly at our field without remote ID in each model. This has come about because the FAA was not staffed or funded to provide a timely response to the large number of FRIA applications the AMA has sent to them on behalf of member clubs.
5. We cannot dispose of old LIPO, Lithium Ion, or LIFE batteries in the dumpster, whether they have been rendered inert or not, because of other prohibited chemicals in the batteries. Members are to be asked to take their own old batteries to Home Depot or Batteries Plus for no-cost recycling. Those that have been collected at the field will be broken down into smaller containers and taken in for recycling to Home Depot or Batteries Plus on the field cleanup day, but this is NOT a normal function that the Club provides for its members. President Frank will send an e-mail to members.
6. President Frank has filled out an SVF application to the AMA to request grant money for our Ramada reconstruction.
7. Some members have apparently been spilling or dumping fuel on the chip seal area South of the ramada pavement. This is causing a problem in the underlayment below the loose gravel on top of the chip seal and will cause us additional expense and problems when the chip seal area is scheduled to be finished during the ramada reconstruction project. President Frank will send an e-mail to members asking that fuel or oil not be spilled in this area.

Adjournment: The meeting adjourned at 7:10 PM.

Sun Valley Fliers Board of Directors Meeting Minutes – January 15, 2024

1. The Zoom internet meeting was opened at 6:02 PM; there was a quorum present.

Secretary's Report: Mike Peck

1. The Dec. 13, 2023 Board of Directors meeting minutes were motioned, seconded, and approved. The Secretary had emailed an advance copy of the January 6, 2024 Club meeting minutes to the Board of Directors and there were no comments or corrections to the Club minutes.

Treasurer's Report:

1. The club treasury balance was reported by Treasurer Oliver Heinen, and it is adequate for the club's needs.
2. Oliver reviewed the Sun Valley Fliers financial accounting for the year 2023 and noted that the Club's dues were insufficient to cover the routine annual operating costs of the Club. He estimated that dues would need to be increased by approximately 30% to cover the usual annual operating costs but requested additional time to validate all calculations and determine the amount of dues increase we need. Tony Quist, our Membership Director, reminded the Board that he had sent out a breakdown of how many Club members were in the Senior, Adult, Junior, and Founders membership categories and further noted that we were the only Club in the valley that offered a senior membership at reduced cost. He also noted that most R/C clubs in the valley do offer a family membership rate. The Board will consider the necessity to keep a reduced cost senior membership category when Oliver completes his calculations of what the membership dues should be increased to for a vote by the Board. The family membership issue was deferred for now.
3. The Treasurer's report was approved by acclamation.

Membership Director's Report: Tony Quist

1. There have been 208 membership renewals to date; 34 previous members still have not renewed. The number of non-renewals is in line with our historical experience from year to year.
2. Tony brought up a membership issue regarding a winter visitor that recently asked several Club members what he needed to do to fly at our field for about two months out of the year. Tony had responded he should join the club, but a couple of members said in the past the Club had accepted a donation. Tony asked the Board for a decision, stating it was not fair to the dues paying members that winter visitors arrive in the valley during prime flying season, use our facilities, and not join & pay the full amount of member dues. Most of the Board agreed with Tony that winter visitors must join the Club as regular members.

Safety Officer's Report: Ken Rhoads

1. Brian Rhoads brought up an issue where a member was flying a turbine jet without a spotter, perhaps in excess of the maximum turbine speed for turbine powered aircraft, and two people were filming the flight which was uploaded on the internet. Brian talked to the member about having to use a spotter and the maximum speed for turbine r/c models but feels perhaps it is time for a rules committee to be established.
2. John Nolte had contacted President Frank about the Board of Directors commenting on 3D pilots that fly over the runway while others are flying at the same time. Brian noted that this was not limited to the two members Mr. Nolte had talked about but was still common during late Saturday evening flight sessions. Brian made a motion to establish a rules committee that he would be happy to work with, along with Dan Bott, and Kenny Rhoads. President Frank suggested an Ad Hoc rules committee to revisit our rules and report back to the Board, consisting of Dan, Brian, and some knowledgeable others Dan may be able to recruit, then report back to the Board.

Information Technology Report: Bobby Santoro

1. The new website is expected to be activated within the next two weeks..

Old Business:

1. Ramada permitting – We believe we are in the final stage awaiting permit approval by the City of Phoenix Commercial Planning Dept.
2. Winter Warbirds event – The CD stated the event is on track and will be held Jan 26-28, 2024.
3. The 2024 Arizona Classics, Scale Jets, and Warbirds event is on track to be held March 14-17. More information on this event will be provided in the future.

New Business:

1. The January 13, 2024 field cleanup was an excellent event. Thank you, Brian Rhoads, for taking the leading role coordinating that, and many thanks to the very numerous Club members that showed up to provide the labor. Tighe O'Meara brought his welding equipment to the field and welded the legs back on to spectator screen for the bleachers. Thank you, Tighe. The bleachers were moved outside the spectator fence near the East end of the runway for Winter Warbirds.
2. President Frank ordered ten 10' X 10' popups from Costco @ \$120 each to provide cover for Winer Warbirds. When no longer needed excess popups will be sold to Club members.
3. The combination to the gate lock will be changed after Jan. 31, 2024. Members of the club in good standing will receive the new combination by e-mail.
4. The final decision regarding increasing our dues and determining the amount needed will be voted on at a future Board meeting based on Oliver's determination on how much is needed to balance our budget.
5. Final preparations are underway for Winter Warbirds; two J-Johns and a Wash Station will be delivered on January 24th. Wiring for charging will be installed and run from the generator. The Board discussed the Gate sign-up sheet status and a few modifications to it.
6. RID (Remote ID Authorization) is in place for the entire Club, meaning there is no requirement by the FAA for models flown at our field to have remote ID.
7. The old tires have all been stacked on the side of the generator shed and still need to be removed. President Frank plans to borrow his son-in-laws dump trailer and either take the tires to a dairy or a tire recycler.
8. MCFD is to repair their gate on Jomax road on Tuesday, Jan 16th.
9. Brian Rhoads would like to have the members of the Board meeting at the field on Saturday, Jan 20th at 9:00 AM to go through the Connex we used for storage and get rid of unneeded items.

Adjournment: The meeting adjourned at 6:55 PM.

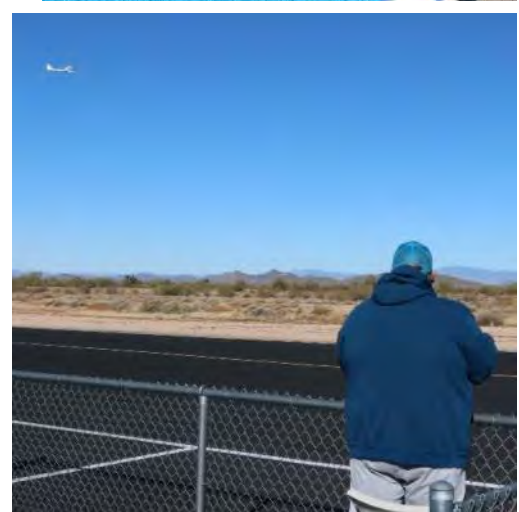

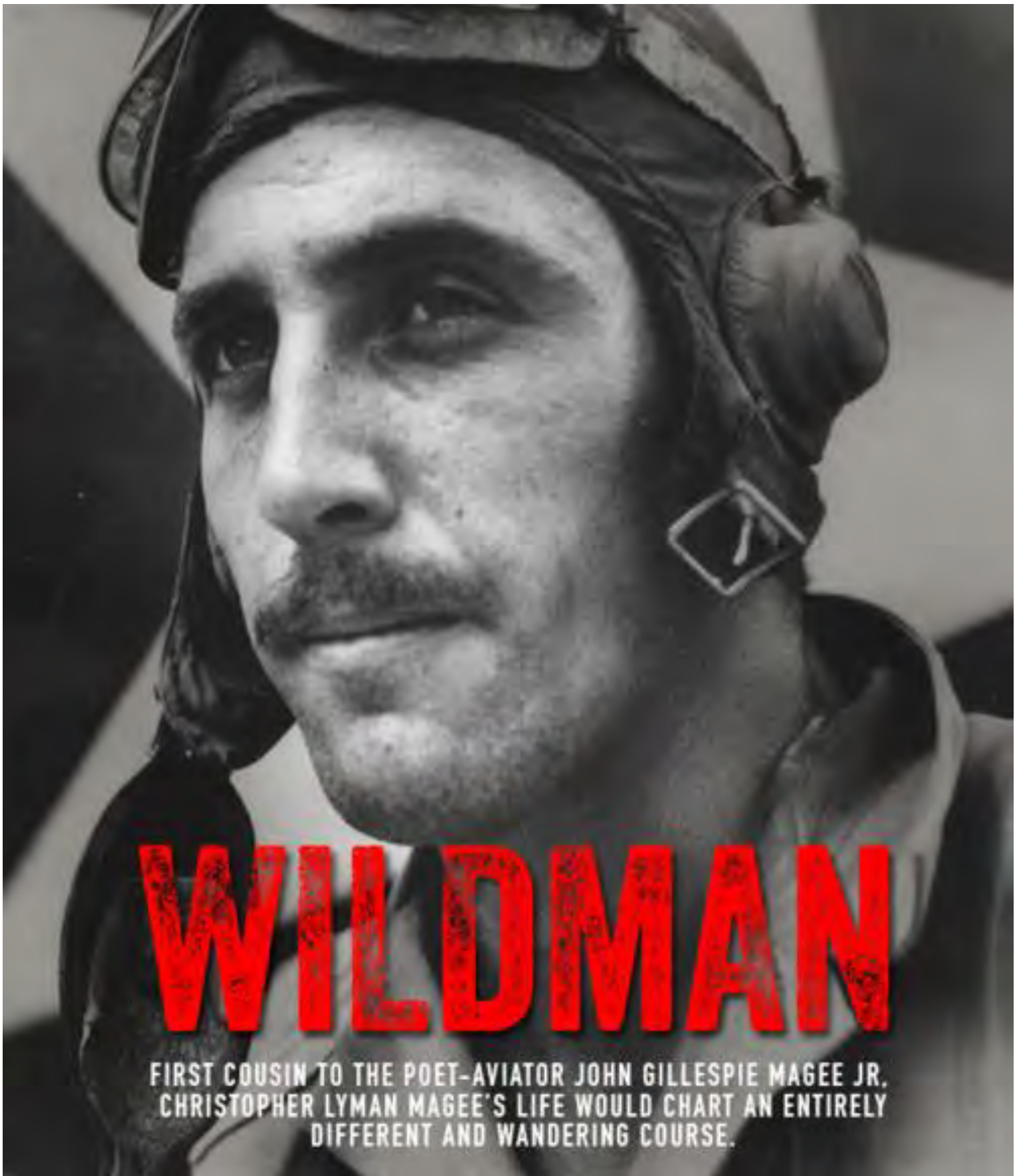

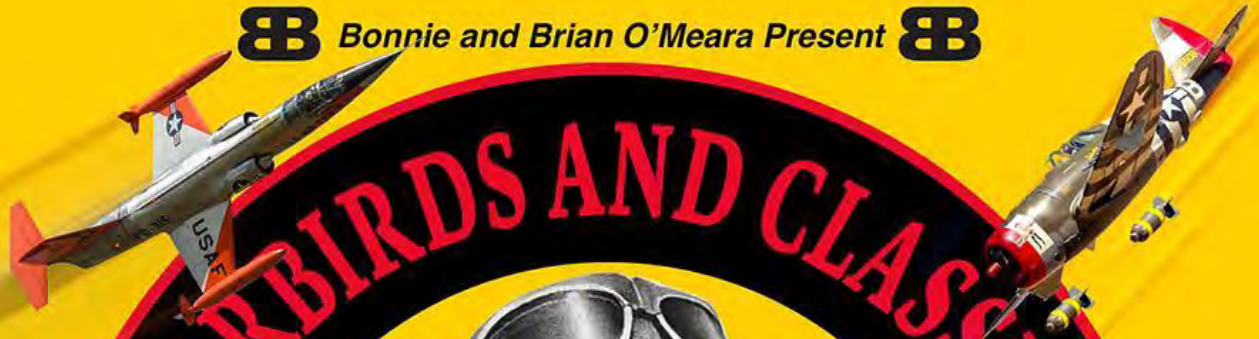

Any pilot willfully violating this rule is subject to loss of flight privelages.

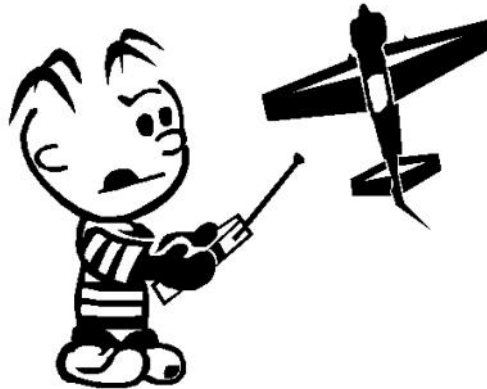
